zbMATH's staff continue to work. However, most of our staff operate remotely. This implies some natural limitations in our major capacity. Right now, we are not able to process printed articles or hard copies of books. This is not a big problem, since most publishing houses kindly provide us with digital metadata and in some cases complete electronic documents. In the case of electronic data, the update process of zbMATH is practically normal.

We receive, edit and upload electronic reviews in our database on a daily basis, almost as usual. However, for the moment we will not be able to process hand-written and printed reviews (not in electronic form). Likewise, hard copies of books are not currently being sent because of the known logistic problems. If you want to review e-books please email us and we will try to arrange it. The respective hard copies can be reserved for you and sent out at a later time.

If you would like to receive more documents in these weeks or if you want to take a break and rest for a while please let us know. Note that for the moment we are only able to deliver electronic documents (including e-books). If your current status says that you receive only hard copy articles (or books) you will not receive anything right now. We would like to warmly thank all those who are continuing to write reviews in this difficult period; thank you!
